## BOROUGH OF ALBURTIS LEHIGH COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA

Ordinance No. 531

(Duly Adopted September 9, 2015)

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 41-802 OF THE ALBURTIS CODIFIED ORDINANCES TO DESIGNATE A HANDICAPPED PARKING SPACE ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF WEST SECOND STREET FOR THE BENEFIT OF 225 WEST SECOND STREET UNTIL DECEMBER 31, 2018, UNLESS TERMINATED SOONER BY COUNCIL, AND TERMINATE HANDICAPPED PARKING SPACES IN THE VICINITY OF 211 SOUTH MAIN STREET AND 44 WEST FRONT STREET WHICH ARE NO LONGER NECESSARY.

WHEREAS, Borough Council has received an application for a handicapped parking space to accommodate the parking needs of a person with a disability; and

WHEREAS, Council desires to establish such a handicapped parking space for a limited period of time; and

WHEREAS, one previously-ordained handicapped parking space is no longer necessary because the relevant person has moved, and another previously-ordained handicapped parking space is no longer necessary because the relevant person has passed away; and

WHEREAS, on September 2, 2015, the Borough published a public notice in the *East Penn Press*, a newspaper of general circulation in the Borough of Alburtis, of its intention to consider and adopt on this Ordinance on September 9, 2015;

**Now, THEREFORE,** be it **ORDAINED** and **ENACTED** by the Borough Council of the Borough of Alburtis, Lehigh County, Pennsylvania, as follows:

**SECTION 1.** Codified Ordinances § 41-802 (relating to Traffic Control—Handicapped Parking Spaces—Designated Spaces) is amended as follows (with deletions indicated by strike outs and insertions indicated by double underlining):

## § 41-802 Designated Spaces.

The following spaces are designated handicapped parking spaces. A particular disabled person is identified for each space, and the designation shall remain in effect until the expiration date for that space, unless terminated sooner by motion or resolution of Council. Unless otherwise indicated below, the length of the space shall be twenty-two (22) feet, and the center of the space shall be the point where the street curbline intersects the center-line of the sidewalk or other access-way used by the disabled person to access the dwelling on the designated property:

SECTION 2. As provided in Codified Ordinances § 41-104 (relating to Traffic Control—General Provisions—Official Signs), the Borough shall erect and maintain official traffic control devices for all locations ordained under Codified Ordinances §§ 41-802, as amended by this Ordinance, in accordance with regulations of the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation; and as provided in Codified Ordinances § 41-803 (relating to Traffic Control—Handicapped Parking Spaces—Signs), all official traffic control devices erected and maintained in connection with the handicapped parking space designated under this Ordinance shall state the penalty provided by law for violations and state that vehicles in violation may be towed.
