§ 23-1. Board established pursuant to statute; powers.

Pursuant to the provisions of the Borough Code, 1966, Feb. 1, P.L. (1965) 1656, No. 581, Sec. 2709, 53 P.S. §§ 47708 through 47713, the power to equip, operate and maintain recreation places is hereby vested in a Recreation Board.

§ 23-2. Membership; terms of office.

The Recreation Board shall consist of five (5) persons, who shall be residents of the Borough of Alburtis. Three (3) members of the Recreation Board shall be appointed by the Council of the Borough of Alburtis. The two (2) other members of the Recreation Board shall be members of the School Board of the East Penn School District or its nominees; provided, however, that such members or nominees shall all be residents of the Borough of Alburtis. The members of the Recreation Board shall serve for a term of five (5) years or until their successors are appointed, except that the members first appointed shall be appointed for

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staggered terms so that not more than one (1) member's term shall expire annually thereafter. Vacancies for the unexpired term shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment.

§ 23-3. Establishment of standards and salary schedules for employees.

Members of the Recreation Board shall serve without pay. The Recreation Board shall exercise its powers and duties in establishing standards, qualifications and salary schedules for employees, which shall, however, be subject to the approval of Borough Council.

§ 23-4. Officers of Board.

The Recreation Board shall elect from its membership annually its own Chairman, Secretary and such other officers as may be deemed necessary for the accomplishment of its purposes.

§ 23-5. Annual report.

The Recreation Board shall submit to the Borough Council in December of each year an annual report which shall include an analysis of community recreation areas, facilities and leadership with particular reference to the extent or adequacy of the programs and their effectiveness in view of the public expenditures involved and public needs.

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
